MALAYSIA'S BUDGET 2021 COMMITED TO SPURRING THE GREEN **ECONOMY AGENDA AMID THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC**

BANGI – Malaysian Green Technology and Climate Change Centre (MGTC) welcomed the tabling of the 2021 Budget themed Teguh Kita, Menang Bersama by the YB Finance Minister on driving economic growth, sustaining life and strengthening public service delivery. The Budget 2021 reflected the Government's commitment to spurring the green economy agenda amid the Covid 19 pandemic.

In ensuring environmental sustainability and boosting the Green Economy, the Government proposed to continue with the successful Green Technology Financial Scheme with an allocation of RM2 billion which would encourage the private sector, mainly the manufacturing and services industry, to participate in green technology.

Similarly, with the introduction of Sustainability Bond under Sukuk Prihatin would further support the Green Economy growth. We also applaud the introduction of the Save 2.0 program with an allocation of RM 30 million to encourage households to purchase energy efficiency appliances worth RM200.
