BANGI 22 February 2023: Solarpack Corporación Tecnológica S.A.U (Solarpack) has signed an agreement with Green Growth Asia Foundation (GGAF) to champion our nation's ambitious goal to achieve carbon neutrality through the Eco-Schools programme (ESP). The Green Growth Asia Foundation targets 1000 Eco-Schools to be established in Malaysia by 2025. It needs support from various partners such as the State Education Departments, local authorities, government agencies, universities, and the private sector to realize this goal.

MGTC has supported ESP and GGAF's efforts by raising awareness through briefing sessions and activities with industry players. CEO of MGTC, Ts. Shamsul Bahar Mohd Nor said, "We catalyse and connect industries with initiatives that will empower businesses to create partnerships for sustainability in reducing their environmental footprint, strengthen their exposure, and improve their operational and financial performance. Echoing the theme of this year's Global Education Day, 'to invest in people, prioritize education', MGTC believes the ESP will provide a great opportunity for Solarpack to get involved and show their 100% commitment to supporting all activities that will create sustainability awareness to the young generation."
